WORKSHOP ON MANNERS AND ETIQUETTES

Grade: 2 to 4

Time: Activity periods

Learning objectives:

1. To help kids understand good manners, especially in wishing elders, 'Be on left' rule, conduct while moving in a group, to mind p's and q's (thank you, please, sorry).
2. To learn the correct table manners.

Materials Required:

1. Food items (to be eaten by knife/ fork/ spoon) to be served in dining hall two or three times in that week (31st March to 7th April).
2. Ice cream for the best behaved class from each grade.

Plan:

Sl. No.	Time/ Duration	Activity
1.	15 mins.	Video on manners and dining etiquettes and a small discussion
2.	40 mins	Role play by students
3.	5 mins.	An interactive PPT to reinforce the learning

Plan in detail:

During the **Activity periods**, students will be shown videos on manners and dining etiquettes.

Students will be divided into 6 groups of 5 students each and will be given situation to enact.

<p>Group 1- At School: Students moving along corridors or in open areas of the school and not wishing adults (teachers , school guests etc) At Home: Children entering home and not wishing uncles, aunts etc.Or going to birthday party and not wishing hosts (parents of birthday girl) on entering nor saying thank you, had a good time aunty on leaving the party.</p>	<p>Group – 2 Ideal Behaviour: Students wishing all in school at all times of the day. Visiting home of friends Attending Birthday Party Welcoming guests at home.</p>
Group 3 dining (bad habits)	Group 4 dining (good habits)
Group 5 (disrespectful talk)	Group 6 (usage of please, thank you, sorry)

Teacher can conclude the session by showing an interactive PPT wherein students will say which manners are acceptable.

Reward for best behaved class in dining hall

Students will be observed for one week in the dining hall. They will be judged on how they open the chairs when entering the dining hall, their way of food intake (closing mouth and chewing, proper usage of cutlery), passing the bowls instead of moving around.)

One teacher will be allotted to observe one grade and best behaved class from each grade will be given ice cream on 10th April.
